The 2024 growing season in Anderson Valley was defined by contrast, offering both challenge and opportunity. Abundant winter rainfall recharged vineyard soils and filled irrigation ponds, setting the stage for healthy vine growth. Budbreak arrived early, with warm March weather waking the vines and helping set a strong crop. Early summer brought steady warmth, but a sharp heat spike in July reduced yields and concentrated flavors in the remaining clusters. These extremes ultimately accelerated the season, leading to an early harvest that began at our Bearman Bend Vineyard on September 4 and concluded on September 25 at our Monument Tree Vineyard.

A warm vintage like 2024 often delivers generous fruit concentration, while the early harvest preserves freshness and bright acidity—and both are on full display in this lively Pinot Noir. Aromatics are layered with Anderson Valley's signature dark cherry, redwood needles, and warm spice, with brambleberry and cola adding depth and complexity. On the palate, opulent black fruit is lifted by notes of black tea and cinnamon. Velvet-like tannins feel refined and seamless, carrying through to a long, lingering finish framed by vibrant acidity. A compelling Anderson Valley Pinot Noir to enjoy now, this wine has the balance and structure to continue to evolve in the years to come.
